Re: Parks and Open Space Plan  
Suggestions from **SHCA**

We wish to thank you for the opportunity to contribute to the referenced plan and we have studied particularly those sections directly impacting the Sandy Hook community. Our Parks Director, Michael Davidson, presented a report at our recent board meeting and it was accepted unanimously with the instruction that the report's contents be sent onward to you. He reported as follows:

## **P. 16. 2.5.2 Age Distribution by Neighbourhood**

The graph of Sandy Hook's population shows the largest concentration in the 45-60 year old age group. Because of the prevalence of expensive view properties, fewer younger families are moving into the area. The ageing of our local population shifts the need away from playing fields (as recommended on page 21, 3.3.5) towards natural parks with walking trails (Such as the Hidden Grove, p.53, 4.8.19), which are identified as the "most often used park and open space facilities in the District of Sechelt." (p.10. 2.4) Younger residents' needs could be met by the proposed mountain bike park in the northern portion of the Hidden Grove proposal, as well as the playing fields attached to the future elementary school that forms part of the Terraces development.

## **p. 21 3.3.5 Sandy Hook**

The idea that undeveloped park land on Skookumchuk Rd., near two mini-parks might be sold for other parkland in Sandy Hook is an interesting idea, but would benefit from broad consultation with the community before proceeding.

**P.50 4.8.11 Sechelt Heritage Forest Trail** This trail begins at Inlet Road as it bisects the Sechelt Heritage Forest. Unfortunately, it immediately runs into a steep escarpment which makes it inappropriate for cycling, although a hiking trail does switch back up the grade. The only real option is to use the paved roads (Inlet to Sandy Hook Road) for this portion of the proposed route.

**p. 53 4.8.19 Hidden Grove D.L. 3006** Please note that we are the Sandy Hook Community Association (not "rate payers").

We look forward to progress with parks and open spaces development and thank you again for this opportunity.
